# **Barriers to Practicing Community-led Health Research**

Below are the key themes and barriers to community-led health research participants identified:

#### **Structural Barriers**

- System designed to extract means of production from communities, limiting their ability to live a healthy life
- Institutional policies that hinder applying resources to community needs
- Lack of validation in academic spaces, which can have a chilling effect on pre-tenure scholars
- Lack of understanding and recognition of Indigenous knowledges, cultures, and traditional medicines
- Lack of resources and stable funding for community-based organizations
- Competitive funding models and insufficient funding for long-term sustainability

### **Cultural and Linguistic Barriers**

 Cultural and linguistic barriers prevent marginalized populations from participating in community-based participatory research (CBPR)





- Language and cultural barriers in working with Latino and African American families in predominantly white/native communities
- Racism in the medical field, education, and justice system faced by African Americans
- Misunderstandings and miscommunications due to lack of cultural competence and understanding of community contexts

### **Organizational Barriers**

- Obstacles in accessing resources and performing research to mitigate social challenges
- Time constraints, lack of communication, and financial struggles
- Psychological barriers, objections, and reactions in incorporating social justice, anti-racism, cultural competence, and reflection in engagement practices
- Fear of internal or public criticism and controversy in poorly executed community engagement projects
- Bureaucratic processes and administrative burdens delaying or hindering project implementation

## Power Dynamics and Institutional Constraints

- Power imbalances between academic researchers and community members hinder genuine partnership
- Institutional constraints and policies that do not support community-led research approaches
- Academic reward structure focused on grant funding and high-impact journal publications, undervaluing community engagement and dissemination of research findings
- Ethical guidelines (IRB restrictions) that do not align with community needs, often protecting institutions over people
- Disconnect between community-led initiatives and academic or institutional priorities

## Trust and Relationship Building

- Structural barriers such as systemic racism and discrimination create an environment of mistrust between researchers and community members
- Lack of cultural competence and understanding of the cultural contexts of communities can lead to misunderstandings and miscommunications





- Historical and ongoing inequities leading to a lack of trust between researchers and communities
- Need for genuine, reciprocal relationships beyond formal agreements

### Long-term Commitment and Sustainability

- Long-term commitment beyond funded grant projects and the need for resources to sustain partnerships
- Focus on short-term returns on investment and lack of value attributed to community-led research
- Insufficient funding, lack of resources, and opportunities for growth and mentorship
- Financial difficulties impacting the ability to participate in research
- Individual needs conflicting with principles of partnership, such as the need for income affecting the flow of resources to the community

## **Knowledge and Information Barrier**

- Lack of access to information, resources, and authentic research
- Lack of understanding, awareness, and trust in community insights and Indigenous knowledge
- Lack of language and communication that resonates with the scientific community and validation in academic spaces
- Community insights often dismissed as anecdotal or less-than evidence

## **Barriers to Practicing Community-Led Health Research**

- Lack of funding, recognition, and support for community partnerships
- Unwillingness to invest in partnerships that address root causes, focusing more on short-term program-based solutions
- Bias, systemic racism, lack of accountability, security, and privilege mentalities
- Need for unlearning traditional research approaches and overcoming biases in predominantly white institutions

## Barriers to Applying Principles of Community-Led Health Research

- Complexity and underestimation of applying principles, especially by those lacking respect and expertise in community-led research
- Lack of passion, commitment, and humility to honor the expertise of the partnership and community members





- Racism, lack of resources, and ongoing adversities that impede progress and improvement
- Lack of training and support for both academic researchers and community members

#### **Additional Barriers**

- Lack of sincerity, mutual respect, and humility in partnerships
- Lack of flexibility and dedicated time for community partnerships and research
- Lack of accountability measures to address biases and systemic racism
- Lack of dissemination of research findings directly to the community and establishing trusting relationships
