



Similarities Among Anti-Racist and Anti-Colonial Research

Focus on marginalized groups or communities.

Centering whiteness

People often erroneously assume that only those impacted should intervene.

Similar preferences of practices; shared power, mutual respect, reciprocity, value of wisdom gained from experience.

WHITE SUPREMACY

The intersections of race, ethnicity, nation, class

DANGEROUS

Imagining new ways of being

Both are MISSING intersections of disability & age, gender & sexuality

Opposition to white supremacy

Centering of those marginalized by white supremacy

Context matters more than individuals.

Recognition of various modes of research (qual, quant, mixed)

Looking for new methods.

Anticolonial is often (but not always) inherently anti-racist (ie. colonial oppression often operates via racism)

ADVOCATE & RESPECT THE COMMUNITY WE WANT TO CREATE THE CHANGE FOR AND WITH THEM!

Accountability

Recognize that English is not the only language of science.

Both require being intentional and deliberate

They're linked in that they address things that can be a result of the other.

Challenging the notion of objectivity.

Centering the need of historically oppressed groups.

Same origin of deconstructing power, positionality, and centering historically silenced voices.

Centers marginalized PIs, populations, perspectives.

ACR and AAR approaches are converging in response to global crises (eg. Gaza, Israel, Palestine)
